- > Bucket Calves and Commercial Heifers are welcome to be brought to this tagging. Please note that Bucket Calves must be tagged by Sunday, April 21st and Commercial Heifers must be tagged by June 13th. For Commercial heifers that are not at County Tagging, please contact the Butler County Extension Office to schedule a time to have them tagged. If you have Bucket Calves, please see the beef packet for an additional tagging option.

### **Requirements:**

- YQCA: YQCA is REQUIRED to be eligible to exhibit ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITS (Except Horses) at the 2024 Butler  $\checkmark$ County Fair and must be completed by May 30th, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. to be eligible to participate. YQCA information can be found at: www.butler.ksu.edu/4-H/YQCA
- $\checkmark$ ENROLLMENT: Please double check that your 4-H / FFA members are enrolled in 4-H / FFA for the 2023-2024 year and are also enrolled in the Beef Project by May 1st, 2024.
- $\checkmark$ TWO (2) FORMS FOR MARKET STEERS, DAIRY STEERS & MARKET HEIFERS: Animal Care & Housing and Owner Certification of Market Animals. Please refer to the enclosed packet and each form for additional information. Make sure all 4-H / FFA members and Parent/Guardians sign the form. # **4-H BUCKET CALF INFORMATION**

It is time to plan for your bucket calf tagging! All bucket calves must be tagged by 6:00 p.m. on April 21st, 2024 in order to be eligible to be exhibited at the 2024 Butler County Fair. You have 2 options for tagging.

- Option #1 Bring them to the beef county tagging on February 24th from 7:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. at the Flinthills High School FFA Ag Facility, 806 SE Rosalia Rd, Rosalia, KS 67132
- 2. **Option #2** Bring them to the small animal tagging event. This will be held on April 21st between 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. at the Butler County Extension Office.

# The tag cost will be \$4.00 and must be paid by cash or check at the time of tagging; please bring exact change.

#### **Requirements:**

- ✓ YQCA: YQCA is <u>REQUIRED</u> to be eligible to exhibit <u>ALL ANIMAL PROJECTS</u> (Except Horses) at the 2024 Butler County Fair and must be completed by May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. to be eligible to participate. - ✓ ENROLLMENT: Please double check that your 4-H members are enrolled in 4-H for the 2023-2024 year and also enrolled in the Beef Project by May 1st, 2024.

# Animal Care and Housing for Butler County 4-H / FFA Animals

It is the responsibility of the 4-H / FFA member(s) to ensure that proper care is taken of their animal(s) by following acceptable methods of good animal husbandry. A healthy animal requires sufficient food, water, shelter, and appropriate health care. Specific animal husbandry guidelines and humane training methods are provided in 4-H / FFA manuals available upon request from the Butler County Extension Office. The Kansas 4-H / FFA Youth Development Policies, Best Management Practices, and Information states that "Youth should provide the primary care and training for livestock or animal projects for the duration of the project." Primary care is defined as the 4-H / FFA member(s) making the decisions for and/or providing the care, handling, and training of their animal project a majority of the time.

**Submission of this animal care document is required by** <u>all</u> **4-H** / **FFA animal project participants each year.** *This includes bucket calves, poultry, rabbits, and horses. It also includes beef, swine, meat goats, dairy goats, and sheep* 

Household Nominations for market and breeding animals						
Youth will be allowed to enter and show any animal that was nominated by their household according to the following restrictions:						
<ul> <li>Youth must all legally reside in the same household and share the same legal address.</li> <li>The youth entering the animal must have materially participated in the care of the project for the majority of the time.</li> </ul>						
- Youth will determine which animal they will exhibit at show check-in. (before weigh-in).						
<ul> <li>How the animal was nominated at tagging will decide whether the animal is shown as market or breeding. For example - a female tagged only as market will not be allowed to showed as breeding and vice versa, unless they were dual nominated.</li> </ul>
