

**2017 HUNTER EDUCATION
PRE-ENROLLMENT IS REQUIRED FOR ALL COURSES.**

The Hunter Education courses are open to anyone. **No fee is required. No one under the age of 11 will be certified in Hunter Education. Those under age 11 may take the course with special permission from the instructor. Anyone taking the Hunter Education courses prior to age 11, will be required to take the course again for certification after turning 11.**

Course Number One – August 4 and 5

Check-in is Friday evening, August 4, from 5:30 to 6:00pm.
Session one is from 6:00 to 9:00pm, Friday, August 4.
Session two is from 8:00 am to about 4:00 pm, Sat., Aug. 5

Attendance is required both Friday evening and all day Saturday. This course is being held at the Butler County 4-H/Community Building, 200 N. Griffith, El Dorado, KS. Pre-enroll by calling the Butler County Extension Office, 316-321-9660 between July 1 and August 2. Enrollment is limited, so call early. Pre-enrollment is required. No drop-ins will be accepted.

Course Number Two – September 16

Pre-Enrollment is REQUIRED. This is an **Internet Assisted** Hunter Education Course. September 16 is the field day for the course.

Check-in is from 7:30 am to 8:00 am. Class starts at 8:00 am and will end at about 3:30 pm.

There will be a lunch break from about 11:30 am to 12:30pm.

Pick up a student manual and written course instructions at the Extension Office prior to the Field Day.

Read and follow the directions below to complete the field day.

Field Day Instructions:

You must have access to a computer AND a printer in order to complete the online portion of an Internet-Assisted course. **DO NOT REGISTER FOR AN INTERNET-ASSISTED COURSE IF YOU DO NOT HAVE ACCESS TO A COMPUTER AND A PRINTER!**

This independent study method, a three-part process, requires pre-registration in an Internet-assisted Field Day and Testing Session, completion of the Kansas online hunter education course AND active participation in an Internet-assisted Hunter Education Field Day and Testing Session.

DO NOT TAKE THE ONLINE COURSE UNTIL YOU HAVE PRE-REGISTERED FOR THE INTERNET-ASSISTED HUNTER EDUCATION FIELD DAY AND TESTING SESSION OF YOUR CHOICE.

1. Sign up for the field day.
2. Go to the Kansas Wildlife, Parks & Tourism website at ksoutdoors.com
3. Follow the prompts to access the on-line test and complete it. Education - Hunter Education - Internet Assisted Course - Free Kansas Internet Assisted Course (Yellow box at the bottom of the page) - take the test.
4. After completing the test, print the completion certificate and bring it with you to the course.

Pre-enroll by calling the Butler County Extension Office, 316-321-9660 between July 1 and September 13. Enrollment is limited, so call early. Pre-enrollment is required. No drop-ins will be accepted.

WHAT IS SHOOTING SPORTS?

4-H Shooting Sports teaches shooting skills, safety and ethics for youth. Any Butler County or surrounding area youth age 8 to 18 years may participate. While the program is sponsored by 4-H, all youth may participate. Young people in the program develop the life skills taught by 4-H, including self confidence, coordination, personal discipline, responsibility and sportsmanship.

Shooting Sports is fun. Immediate results are seen by breaking clay targets, knocking over metal targets, shooting bulls-eyes and observing wildlife.

Shooting Sports is a family program. Parents are involved as firing line assistants and assistant instructors. An adult is expected to attend each meeting with the student.

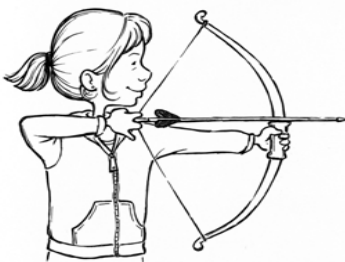
Shooting Sports in Butler County is now a continuing program in which a youngster can begin participation at age 9 in Rifle, and continue through Shotgun, Archery, and Hunter Education.

ARCHERY

Ages 8 to 18. Learn the basics of shooting a bow, then progress to target shooting, hunting and competitive shooting.

Schedule - Archery meetings will be held on Thursday evenings, 7 to 8 p.m., starting in September and running six weeks consecutively. Additional meetings will be scheduled in January and February. Enrollment limit is 12.

Pre-enrollment is required.



RIFLE

Ages 8 to 18. Learn basic and advanced rifle shooting skills and safety. Shooting methods for all calibers and types-from plinking to hunting to Olympic competition. Earn NRA shooting achievement patches and awards. Participate in the J BB Gun, National Guard and American Legion competitions.



Schedule - Tuesdays in September and October starting in September. All meetings start at 7:00 p.m. at the 4-H Building. Basic, Intermediate and Advanced shooting. The J BB Gun Teams will be selected from the Fall participants.

January, February and March - Basic, Intermediate, and Advanced shooting. Schedule to be announced.

Pre-enrollment is required.

SHOTGUN

Ages 8 to 18. Learn basic shotgun skills and safety. Progress to advanced skill levels, learn to shoot trap and skeet, learn to hunt wild game if you wish. Shoot for NRA patches and awards. (No 410's PLEASE!)

For details send an enrollment request to the Butler County Extension Office.

Pre-enrollment is required.

PISTOL

Get a grip and learn to aim in 4H Shooting Sports. With a high priority on safety, your child will learn how to handle and shoot a pellet pistol. The class consists of a four week session for beginners, followed by another 4 week intermediate class. Upon completion of the beginning and intermediate class you may continue with advanced pistol.

Pre-enrollment is required.
