ACHIEVEMENT PIN REQUIREMENTS

#3 CLOVER PIN – The Clover Pin is the third in the series of Achievement Pins and may be awarded after receiving the Bronze Pin. To earn this pin, you must complete requirements 1-4 in the current 4-H year and 10 of the additional requirements (numbers 5 through 75).

#4 EMERALD PIN – The Emerald Pin is the fourth in the series of Achievement Pins that a 4-H member may earn and may be awarded after receiving the Clover Pin. To earn this pin, you must complete requirements 1-4 in the current 4-H year and 15 of the additional requirements (numbers 5 through 75).

#5 SILVER PIN - The Silver Pin is the fifth in the series of Achievement Pins that a 4-H member may earn and may be awarded after receiving the Emerald Pin. To earn this pin, you must complete requirements 1-4 in the current 4-H year and 20 of the additional requirements (numbers 5 through 75).

#6 SILVER GUARD PIN - The Silver Guard Pin is the sixth in the series of Achievement Pins that a 4-H member may earn and may be awarded after receiving the Silver Pin. To earn this pin, you must complete requirements 1-4 in the current 4-H year and 25 of the additional requirements (numbers 5 through 75) with at least one (1) in Section 1, and two (2) in each of Sections 2 and 3.

#7 LEADERSHIP PIN – The Leadership Pin is the seventh in the series of Achievement Pins that a 4-H member may earn and may be awarded after receiving the Silver Guard Pin. To earn this pin, you must complete requirements 1-4 in the current 4-H year and 28 of the additional requirements (numbers 5 through 75) with at least one (1) in Section 1, and two (2) in each of Sections 2 and 3.

#8 GOLD PIN — The Gold Pin is the eighth in the series of Achievement Pins that a 4-H member may earn and may be awarded after receiving the Leadership Pin. To earn this pin, you must complete requirements 1-4 in the current 4-H year and 31 of the additional requirements (numbers 5 through 75) with at least one (1) in Section 1, and two (2) in each of Sections 2 and 3.

#9 GOLD GUARD PIN — The Gold Guard Pin is the ninth in the series of Achievement Pins that a 4-H member may earn and may be awarded after receiving the Gold Pin. To earn this pin, you must complete requirements 1-4 in the current 4-H year and 34 of the additional requirements (numbers 5 through 75) with at least one (1) in Section 1, and two (2) in each of Sections 2 and 3.

You may receive a pin only once, and you may receive only one Achievement Pin in a 4-H Year.
