

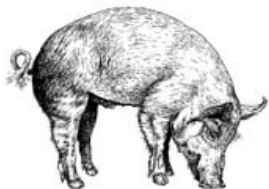

Call the Extension Office if you are not sure of your PQA status.

Frequent Questions:

- Is YQCA mandatory for all 4-H'ers?
YQCA is required to show at the Butler County 4-H Fair and must be completed by June 1st to show at the Fair
- Can someone test out of YQCA?
Not currently, but it is a priority of YQCA to address.
- How much does getting certified cost?
The online module certification is \$12, and the instructor-led training method of certification is \$3.
- Does the YQCA certification ID sync with 4-H online?
Yes, you will sign in using your 4-H Online information.
- I only show horses. Do I need to be YQCA certified?
No. Right now, YQCA, is not required for 4-H Horse Project Members.
- Do 4-H'ers need to update their YQCA certification number each year?
Yes they do. Youth should re-certify around the same time they tested each year.
- Do I need to register before class?
Yes! You must register and pay online before attending an instructor-led class. 7 year olds must rsvp to the Extension office prior to attending the instructor-led class.
- Does Butler County 4-H get the registration money?
No, all registration money is online and goes to YQCA.

Who in Butler County 4-H will be required to be YQCA certified or to attend a meeting?

- 7 Year Olds **MUST** attend an **Instructor-Led Training**
- 8-18 Year Olds **MUST** attend a Instructor-Led Training **OR PASS** a Web-Based Training.

YQCA is REQUIRED by 11:59 PM, June 1st to be Eligible to Exhibit ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITS at the 2020 Butler County 4-H Fair



What is YQCA?

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national, multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 18. This program promotes food safety, animal well-being and character development. With YQCA, you'll discover what it takes to be an informed producer, consumer and employee of the agriculture and food industries.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

A national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 18 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

YQCA includes information for youth showing the following food animals:

- Beef (bucket calf, feeder calf, breeding beef, market beef)
- Dairy Cattle
- Goat (breeding meat goat, dairy goat, meat goat)
- Poultry
- Rabbit
- Sheep (breeding sheep, market sheep)
- Swine (breeding swine, market swine)

***Required for ALL Animal Species at the 2018 Butler County 4-H Fair!**



Goals for the YQCA training and certification program:

- Ensure safety and well-being of animals produced by youth for showing and for 4-H and FFA projects
- Ensure a safe food supply to consumers
- Enhance the future of livestock industry by educating youth on these very important issues so they can become more informed producers, consumers and/or employees in the agriculture and food industry
- Maximize the limited development time and budgets of state and national youth program leaders to provide an effective quality assurance program
- Offer livestock shows a valid, national quality assurance certification for youth livestock exhibitors

9. Renew your YQCA Certification annually. Certification good for 1 year from date of exam.
