Checks for the Livestock/Project Auction will be available to the 4-H/FFA member after buyer's ribbons are picked up and a signed buyer's card or statement has been returned to the Extension Office and as soon as all data for animals has been received back from packers.

Checks must be cashed within 60 days, or they will be voided.

All 4-H/FFA members selling in the Livestock/Project Auction are required to have their buyer's card signed and returned to the Extension office as stated by the due date on the buyer's card in order to be eligible to participate in next year's Livestock/Project Auction. If the 4-H/FFA member should have a Grand Champion animal, they will **NOT be required** to sell at the Livestock/Project Auction.
