NEW THIS YEAR: Per Kansas 4-H Office, all static division entries are limited to ONE entry per division per exhibitor. 4-H Presentations that qualified at Butler County 4-H Days in January with a purple will be submitted via a virtual entry platform. More details coming soon. Butler County will be able to take THREE visual arts pieces for display at the KSF this year. This will be determined by final rankings at the Butler County Fair. Static Exhibit entries will be completed in the Extension Office.

Livestock Check In	 All livestock will check in through a vet check. At the vet check you will receive a "ticket" that identifies that you have been through the vet check. You will need to bring that "ticket" with you to the scales for weigh-in/check-in.
Livestock Stall Survey	 We strongly encourage everyone to show from their trailer and bring their livestock to the arena when it is time for their class. But if a stall is desired, please completed the stall survey by July 15. The survey was emailed to all pre-entered livestock families on July 8 around 6:30 PM.
