

## **Join us at the 2021 Butler County Fair!**



Butler County 4-H members are hard at work around the county making preparation for the 2021 fair that will be held at the county fairgrounds in El Dorado July 15<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup>. While the livestock entries are a crowd favorite, there are many great projects that will be on display! The county fair is an opportunity for our youth to share with the community what they have learned and how they have grown within this past year. Photography, arts

and crafts, rocketry, foods, horticulture and woodworking are all skills that will be on display.

The first two events for the 2021 fair take place on Saturday and Sunday, July 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>. The Fashion Revue demonstrates two different projects and skills that the 4-Her has learned throughout the year in meetings with their local project leader and volunteers in our community. Clothing Construction is one project judged. Participants design and construct an article of clothing and the garment is judged based on the basics of clothing construction.

The second project that is judged is Buymanship. This event allows the participants to select an outfit of their liking to model for the judges. In selecting this outfit, the participant considers where they would wear the outfit, what the cost per wear is, and accessories that might make the outfit pop! They also are given the opportunity to display their public speaking skills as they explain to the judges why they selected the outfit.

The public is invited out to Hope Community Church in Andover on Saturday, July 10<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 PM for a Public Revue where our youth will walk the stage and model their outfits for the community! We would love for you to come out and see these wonderful selections and confident young people walking the stage!

The second event will be held at Three Wooden Crosses Arena on Sunday evening, July 11<sup>th</sup>, starting at 6:00 PM! Come out to the horse show to watch our horse project members demonstrate their skills with their horses. Our 4-Hers will show in a variety of classes such as showmanship, western pleasure, trail, and speed events. It will be a great night to watch our hard working youth show off their talents!

After these first two events the rest of the Butler County Fair will kick-off on Thursday, July 15<sup>th</sup> at the Butler County Community Building and Fairgrounds. There will be many displays of the projects that the youth have worked on during the past year. Come take a stroll through our barns and community building to see all these young people have accomplished and learned! Ask a 4-Her about their animal, photograph, woodworking, rocket, or horticulture exhibit and see their face light up as they explain all the work that went into their accomplishments!
